Below are a just few examples of the programs & initiatives that support Financial Security:

- \$mart Money is a series of financial literacy and coaching classes that are designed to
 provide essential foundations for managing money. Classes include a variety of topics
 including: building a budget, steps to owning a home, how to save for emergencies,
 avoiding scams & frauds, and planning for the future.
 - Through grants from Truist, Wells Fargo and The Foundation for a Healthy High Point, classes are offered at no cost to attendees.
 - Classes are provided in collaboration with Family Service of the Piedmont and the Community Resource Network.
 - Locations vary each month and can be customized based on your workplace preferences, if you would like to host one for your employees.
- Utility and Rental Assistance are offered to qualifying individuals through a collaboration with Open Door Ministries and Salvation Army of High Point.
 - These programs support our community by offering assistance for individuals to stay in their homes when budget constraints occur.
- Providing hope through advocacy, education, and support, with programs offered at:
 - Family Service of the Piedmont Crisis Services, Consumer Credit Counseling
 - The Arc of High Point Education, Inclusion and Empowering independence
 - Open Door Ministries The Father's Table providing hot meals weekly to community members and shelter residents.
 - American Red Cross provides disaster preparedness and helps to meet needs when disaster strikes.

Restoring Heat, Renewing Hope

A client from our food pantry came in with a heartfelt concern—Isabella's heat had been turned off. With colder temperatures approaching, she was deeply worried about how her family, including her three children and aging parents, would stay warm. Her utility balance was overwhelming, making it nearly impossible to restore service on her own.

Through our utility assistance program, in partnership with The Salvation Army, we were able to help. The deposit needed to restore service was paid, and with additional support from other agencies, Isabella received the help she needed to reduce the outstanding balance.

Thanks to this collaborative effort, Isabella and her family were overjoyed to return to a warm home-just in time for the cold weather.
